

**GAIA creates additional Holding Room space for its passengers.**

**Bridgetown, Barbados** – Grantley Adams International Airport has expanded its passenger holding area to particularly accommodate passengers about to board their flights.

GAIA Inc's Operations Manager, Jason Inniss says the extension allows GAIA to better manage passenger flows during peak days of operations when both chartered and scheduled airlines are being serviced.

The Holding Room has been temporarily outfitted with 200 additional seats and at present is being used to facilitate the growing Air-to-Sea passenger programme which ends in April 2015. During the winter season, GAIA will handle in excess of over 250 thousand Air-to-Sea passengers and more than 330 flights.

Mr. Inniss explains that the additional space will also give airlines more room to board passengers and reduced the possibility of flight delays at the Gates.
